Management Report

Financial

Year-to-date, total operating expenses are under budget by approximately \$84,000. Total income year-to-date is over budget approximately \$101,000. In August, Total Operating Cash was

\$1,062,183 and Total Reserve Cash was \$2,138,583.

Administrative

A biweekly update of What's Going on in Valley Ranch continues to be sent by broadcast email to inform residents about chances for community involvement, Valley Ranch events and announcements.

The meetings of the Wine, Book, and Business Networking Clubs were held and memberships continue to grow.

The Lexington Apartments hosted a multifamily breakfast on September 14th for the apartment communities and their property management companies' representatives.

Valley Ranch Polo Day at the Las Colinas Polo Club is scheduled for September 26th.

Preparations for the 2004 Pumpkin Dash & Fall Festival are progressing. A special effort is being made to publicize and promote the Chili Cook-Off and the Pet Photo Contest. Additionally, press releases were sent to television and radio media to ensure that the event is being publicized throughout the Dallas/Fort Worth Metroplex.

The Valley Ranch Associations sponsored a breakfast at Corner Bakery on August 28th for the subassociations in Valley Ranch. Five different sub-associations were represented. The meeting was very productive. Meetings with the sub-associations will be held on a quarterly basis.

Glena Rogers, Chris Wallace and Donna Cuberos met to discuss the charter of the Oncor Task Force. The first meeting of the task force was September 15th. The IFCD, CC&R's, and Get Out The Vote task forces held meetings in August and September.

Remodeling of the new office space has progressed well. A delivery problem with the carpet delayed the project somewhat. New furniture began to arrive September 13th.

Physical

The Maxicom upgrade project is now on schedule to be completed by the end of September. All the wire has been pulled and there are 10 flow meters left to install. The final step is to hook everything up to our controllers.

Again, the installation of the new medians on Valley Ranch Parkway East was delayed. We need an electrical design from Oncor before we can install the wire for the new controller. Once we receive that plan, we should be able to complete the project in two weeks.

Work began in September on brick-wall repairs in areas of Beacon Hill, Glen Cove, and Rancho Vista. Work Walls in the area on the south side of Ranch Trail between Saddlehorn and Valley Ranch Parkway East are also being repaired. If the weather cooperates, the work should be

done by October.

The original hydro mulch on the Lakeside Village slope did not fill in properly. Maintain Services has reseeded the bare areas and they have assured us that they will do whatever is necessary to get a good stand of grass. The IFCD has not yet reimbursed the Association for the project.

Bids were received for filling cracks in 6400 lineal feet of asphalt walkways to prevent water penetration.

The on-site maintenance staff continued with repairs to retaining walls throughout Valley Ranch. They also making minor repairs to the brick soldier course at the base of many of the brick walls.

Canal lighting and electrical repairs were completed throughout The Ranch canals. These repairs are completed on an ongoing basis.

Architectural Review

Building signage was approved for the following businesses: Babes 'N Boy Land (in Valley Ranch Centre), Cold Stone (in Valley Ranch Plaza II), Hunan Dynasty (in MacArthur Ranch), Las Colinas Hair and Nail Spa (in MacArthur Ranch).

Monument signage was approved for the Mac-Arthur Ranch Retail Center (Northeast quadrant of MacArthur and Ranchview). Canopy, pump, and monument signage was approved for Diamond Shamrock in MacArthur Plaza. A complete signage package was approved for the Valley Ranch Office Condominiums at the corner of Ranch Trail and MacArthur. New identification plaques on the two existing brick columns were approved for American Association for Respiratory.

The Committee reviewed 66 plans—8 from builders, 46 from homeowners, 11 from commercial establishments, 1 from a subassociation.

Homeowner submittals were primarily for paint, pools, patio covers and arbors, painting, roof replacement, fence replacement and satellite dishes.

Currently, there are no active lawsuits.

Ranch Task Forces Are Active

In an effort to improve different aspects of Valley Ranch and work with the City of Irving on issues that are important to the community, the Valley Ranch Associations now have task forces that are made up of Valley Ranch volunteers who have a sincere interest in the wellbeing of Valley Ranch.
